They collected sea shells while going on a 3 mile hike on the beach and through the maritime forest habitats. They also were able to investigate the many species of phyto- and zooplankton using plankton nets to take live samples from Mobile Bay, and use microscopes in the laboratory to observe what they caught. Our 6th-9th graders were able to attend Girl Scouts Humanities Day at USM in Hattiesburg. They had a day of learning and fun in Digital Humanities through history, philosophy, linguistics, literature art, archeology, music, and cultural studies. 
