



MISSIONARY VISIT: KINDNESS FOUNDATION

Dr. Olga Lutsenko, founder of Westminster's long-time mission partner, The Kindness Foundation, spoke during a joint Sunday School class on October 13 and during a minute for mission during worship. Dr. Lutsenko detailed her work in providing Bibles for public school students in Russia, Ukraine, and Latvia, especially during the current Russia-Ukraine war. She noted that soldiers on both sides of the conflict have particularly found solace in being able to read God's word. After worship, Dr. Lutsenko shared more about recent travels to Russia and provided an overview of the Stalinist history and cultural attitudes that have contributed to the strife between the two nations.

REFORMATION SUNDAY

Westminster celebrated the 507th anniversary of the Protestant Reformation on October 27. The service featured bagpipe solos and bagpipe and organ duets; two great Reformation era hymns, "A Mighty Fortress Is Our God" and "I Greet Thee



Who My Sure Redeemer Art;" and a sermon on Psalm 46, Martin Luther's inspiration for "A Mighty Fortress." This annual celebration reflects Westminster's unique heritage: Biblical, catholic, protestant, reformed, and presbyterian.
